He has conserved lands in the Truckee River watershed while protecting open space, promoting recreation, and improving the quality of life in the community.

Jay Francis of Collins Pine Company is being recognized for his outstanding sustainable forestry management and leadership. The management of Collins Almanor Forest has earned certification from the Forest Stewardship Council since 1993. This forest supports a diverse ecosystem, produces a variety of sustainable products to the community, and contributes to the natural beauty of the Almanor Basin and the Deer Creek watershed.

Bernie Vlach & Todd Thallhamer, Gerri Silva, and Norma Santiago of the California Integrated Waste Management Board, El Dorado County Environmental Management, and the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors will also be honored. This team exuded tireless commitment to implement the unique and timely Angora Fire Recovery Plan. Their success has restored hope and confidence within inter-agency efforts and demonstrates the essence of cooperation after the dramatic effects of the catastrophic wildfire in South Lake Tahoe.
